It is open access under an innovative community-supported journal model, with library "shareholders" providing substantive support in lieu of subscriptions.




No APCs for our institution's authors and no embargo period

Open Access + Enhanced Discoverability = Greater Impact



Since JAFSCD became open access on January 1, 2018, access and readership have increased dramatically, as shown in the chart and sample article metrics (data from Altmetric). Submissions have increased substantially as well.
